House Keeping

- Kenneth McComber will staff the Chief Kiosk this Thursday, November 26th at the Kahnawà:ke Services Complex. Chief Carl Horn also expressed interest in staffing the Kiosk.
- Martin Leborgne visited the Mercier Bridge this morning. The Mohawk Bridge Consortium provided Leborgne with the plans for the new detour configuration in preparation for the reconstruction of the route 138 down ramp. He also reported that lead testing is expected to commence this week.

Request For Decision: Housing Policy Reaffirmation
