Tioweró:ton Development and Cabin Ownership Procedure Review

Who should attend?

All community members are encouraged to participate, including cabin owners and non-cabin owners.

What is being reviewed?

Specific sections of the Tioweró:ton Development and Cabin Ownership Procedure related to cabin site allocation, land stewardship, safety, and enforcement.

Why is this review taking place?

To ensure the procedure remains clear, fair, and aligned with community values while supporting the responsible use and long-term care of Tioweró:ton.

Which sections are being examined?

The review focuses on five key areas:

- Eligibility Criteria
- Proof of Eligibility
- Two-Year Time Limit for Cabin Construction
- Unfinished or Hazardous Structures
- Enforcement

Why is the two-year construction timeline under review?

The procedure currently requires cabin construction to be completed within two (2) years of site allocation. The review will consider whether this timeframe remains appropriate and how delays or extension requests should be addressed.

How are unfinished or hazardous cabins being addressed?

The review will examine how abandoned, unsafe, or incomplete structures should be managed to protect community safety and the land, including expectations related to maintenance, cleanup, or removal.
